

WEAPON SURRENDER BINS:

What Are Weapon Surrender Bins?

A weapon surrender bin is a secure container where you can safely dispose of a knife, blade, or other weapon. Once deposited in the bin the weapon will be removed by professionals and destroyed.

The bin has been specifically designed to offer maximum safety, and items deposited in the bin are secure until they are removed by professionals. These bins are part of a broader initiative to reduce violence and enhance public safety.

How Do They Work?

Simply locate a weapon surrender bin in your area and deposit the weapon inside. The bins are regularly monitored and emptied by professionals to ensure the safe disposal of the surrendered items.

What Are Bleed Control Kits?

Bleed control kits are essential emergency tools designed to help manage severe bleeding before professional medical help arrives. These kits contain vital supplies such as tourniquets, dressings, and gloves, enabling individuals to provide immediate trained in critical situations.

Why Use Bleed Control Kits?

- **Life-Saving:** Rapid intervention with bleed control kits can significantly increase the chances of survival in cases of severe bleeding.
- **Preparedness:** Having bleed control kits readily available in public spaces ensures that communities are better prepared to handle emergencies.

How Do They Work?

In the event of severe bleeding, locate a bleed control kit and follow the instructions provided. The kits are designed for quick and effective use, helping to stabilize the injured person until professional medical help arrives.
